The cash award was increased this year and funds are earmarked for students pursuing a degree in an agricultural-related field. Scholarship funds are part of Foremost Farms USA Charitable Foundation and are largely generated by employee-sponsored events and an annual vendor golf outing.

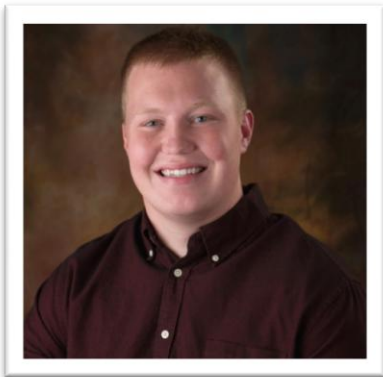
